In 2022 – the first year of full in-person programming since the pandemic – we saw notable increases in students reporting that our programs impacted their sense of belonging. But what does that mean?

In return, CBOBS' dedicated donors showed us how much CBOBS matters to them and to the communities we serve. 


DOMAINS OF THRIVING

The Domains of Thriving framework combines Outward Bound's 50+ years of experience facilitating life-changing experiences with the latest insight and research on social-emotional development.

The Domains of Thriving highlights the four areas of human development that are impacted on an Outward Bound course: Courage, Belonging, Reflection, and Physical Engagement. It also identifies eight specific social-emotional skills that our students are supported to develop: Perseverance, Assertiveness, Group Relationships, Teamwork, Self-Awareness, Social-Responsibility, Self-Regulation and Physical Confidence. Surrounding all of this are our Conditions for Learning, which provide the foundation for transformative learning experiences.

OVERCOMING SETBACKS

Young people are faced with surmounting challenges. Resilience is needed for what's ahead.

On Outward Bound expeditions, students build communities that empower them to find the support they need to take risks. In these safe learning spaces, students realize they are "crew, not passengers" and can build resilience skills to tackle the real life challenges in their schools and communities. CBOBS BELONGS IN DC

As we continued to expand our work in the greater Washington, DC region, we also moved into a new office space at the Josephine Butler Parks Center which overlooks Meridian Hill Park in the Northwest. The Center is an 18,000 square-foot Renaissance Revival mansion, and once home to the Brazilian Embassy. Today, it is owned and operated by Washington Parks & People as an incubator for community-based nonprofits like Chesapeake Bay Outward Bound School.

The DC campus focused on being outward facing, getting out into the community and engaging key stakeholders in philanthropy and education about our work.

With our mobile climbing wall parked at Marvin Gaye Park in Ward 7, we joined Washington Parks & People and others for the annual Ward 7 Harvest Festival to meet our neighbors. CBOBS crew Lainie Grey and Chris Doyle were on hand to demonstrate that Outward Bound programs can happen anywhere.
